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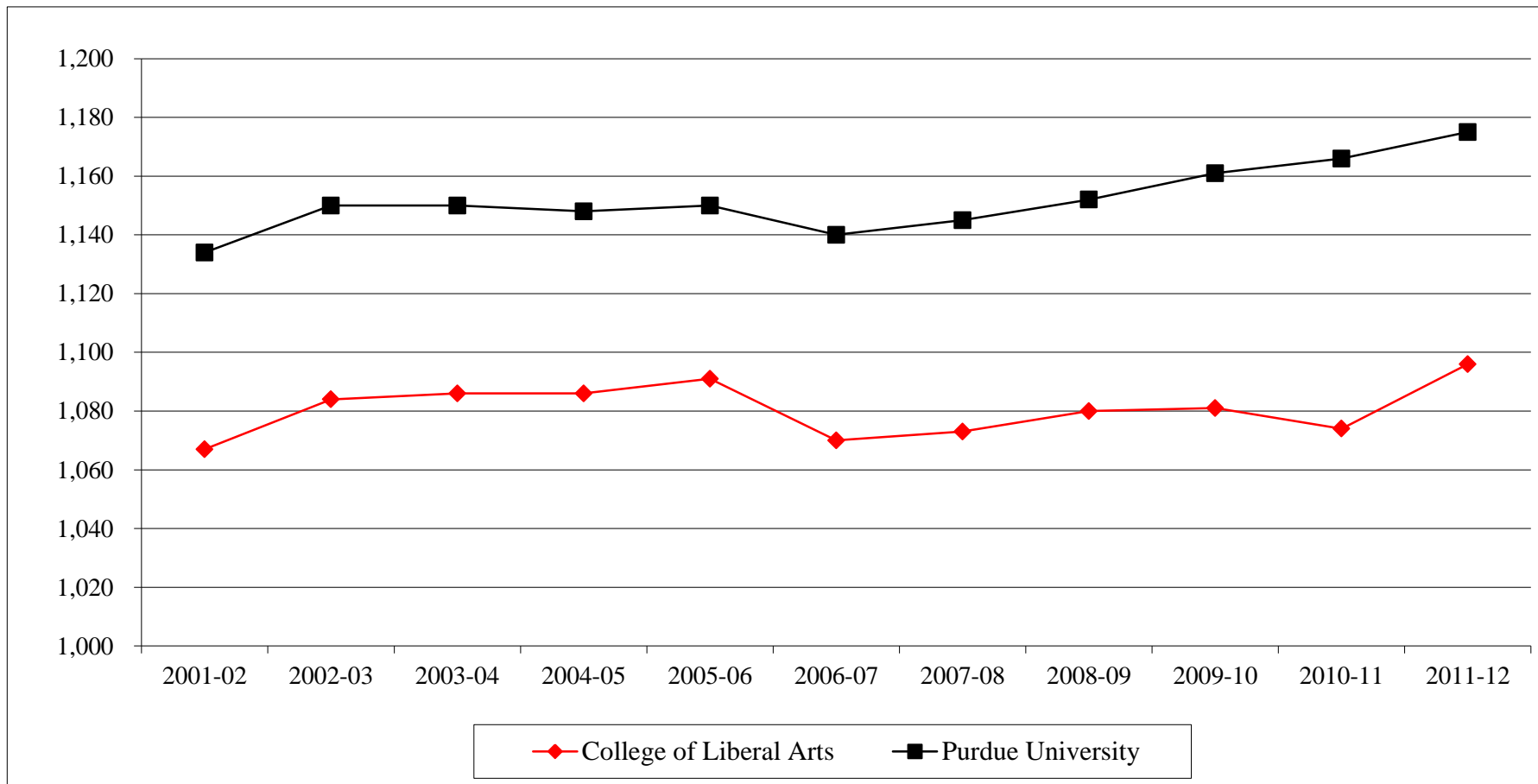

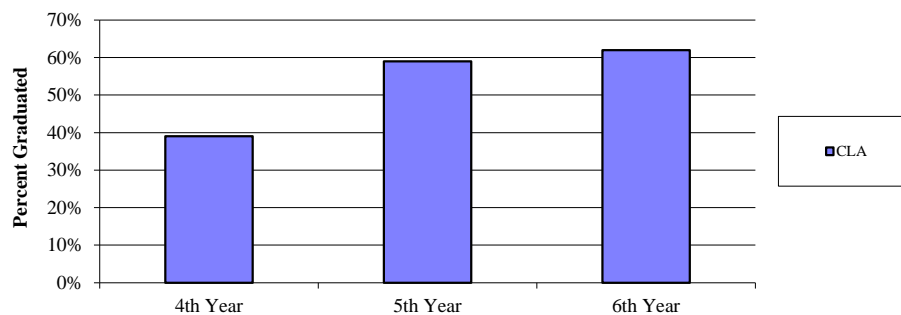

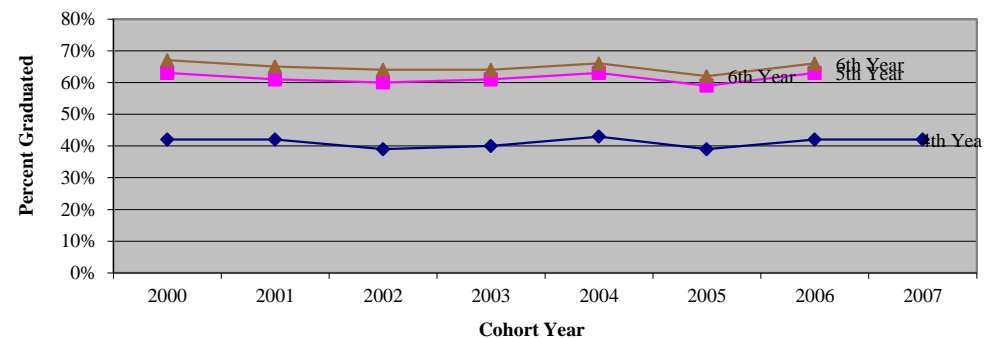

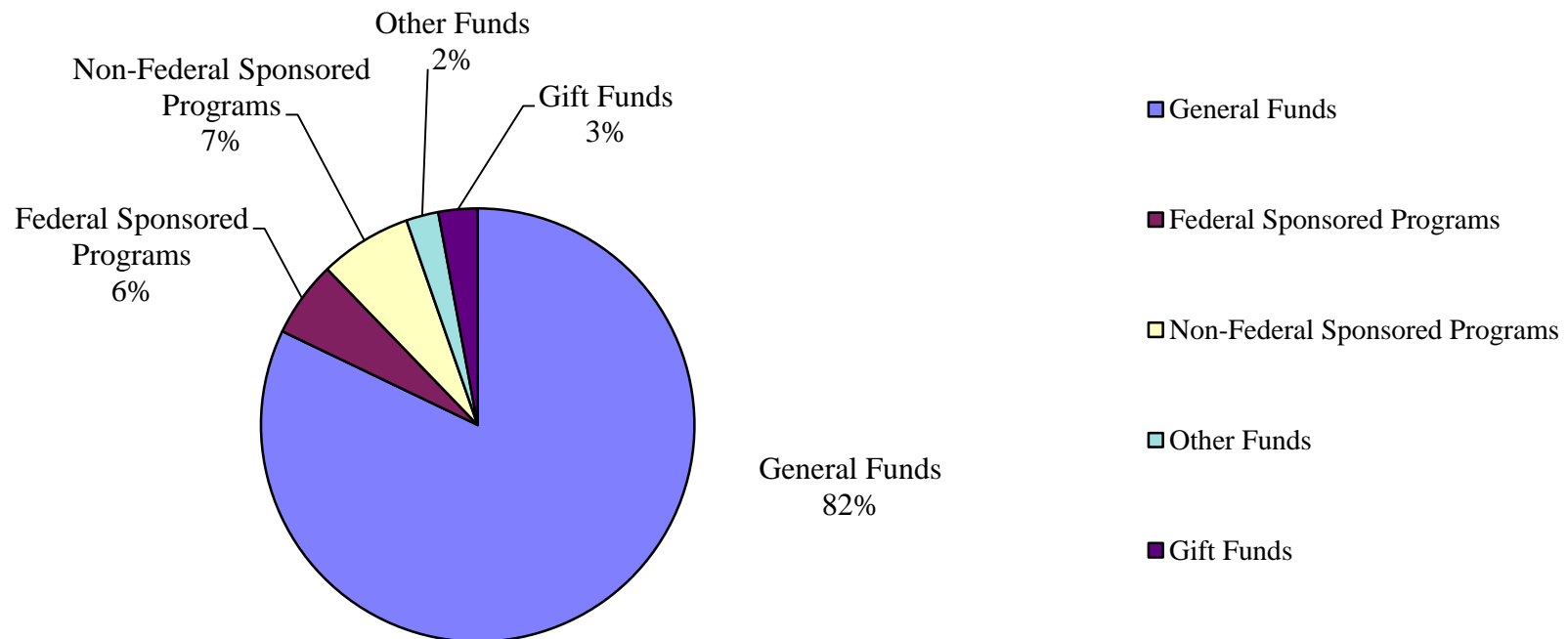

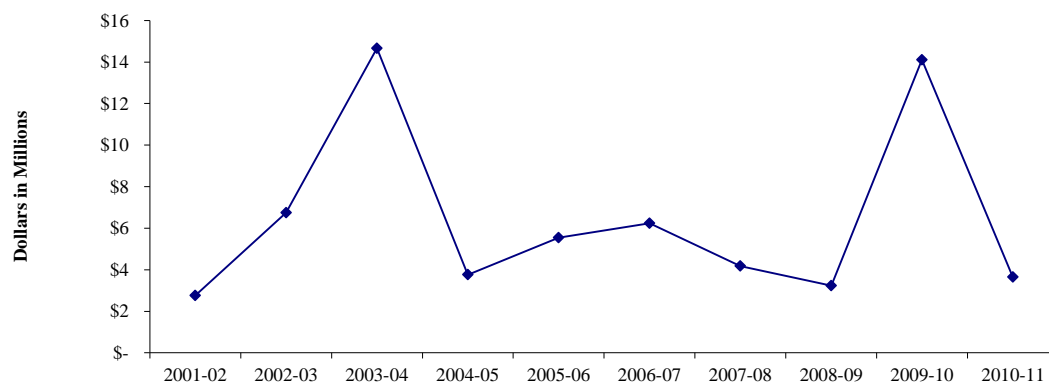

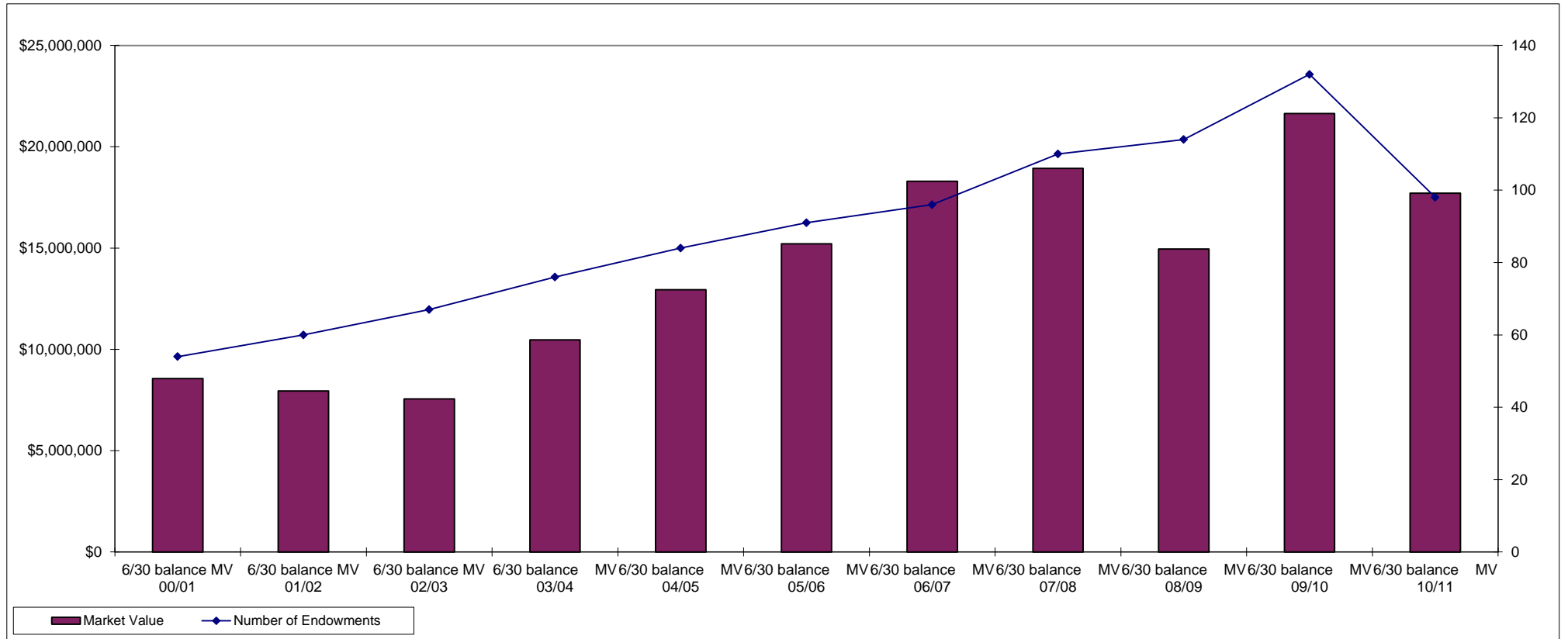
Trend in Giving 2001-02 through 20010-11

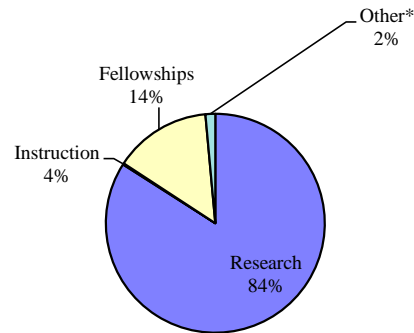

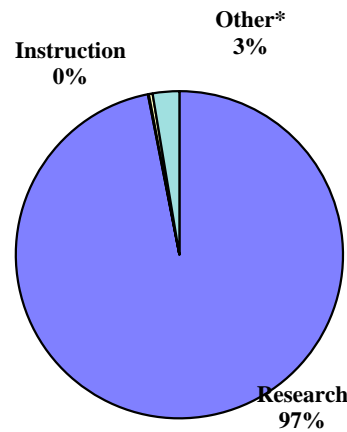
