Module 1

ANTH 10000 INTRODUCTION TO ANTHROPOLOGY

Distance Learning Schulze May 18-June 12
A general introduction to anthropology's holistic approach to human nature and behavior. A basic survey of bicultural development and evolutionary process, and of human uniformity and diversity through time and across space. CRN 22294

ANTH 20500 HUMAN CULTURAL DIVERSITY

Distance Learning Smith May 18-June 12
Using concepts and models of cultural anthropology, this course will survey the principal cultural types of the world and their distribution, and will undertake a detailed analysis of society's representative of each type. CRN 11771

ANTH 34000 GLOBAL PERSPECTIVES ON HEALTH

Distance Learning Smith May 18-June 12
This course examines health issues and risks faced by individuals around the world, but especially in resource poor geographical areas. We will explore in-depth the gendered, ethnic, cultural, and class dimensions that underlie the patterning of disease and illness worldwide. CRN 12689

ANTH 20500 HUMAN CULTURAL DIVERSITY

Distance Learning Huang June 15–August 7
Using concepts and models of cultural anthropology, this course will survey the principal cultural types of the world and their distribution, and will undertake a detailed analysis of society's representative of each type. CRN 19545

ANTH 21000 TECHNOLOGY AND CULTURE

Distance Learning Pike June 15 – August 7
This course explores the social dimensions of technology from the perspective of ancient, modern, and post-modern society. Topics include the origins of particular technologies; processes of technical development and dissemination; the politics of everyday artifacts; virtual identities; and technologies of the body. ANTH 21200 CULTURE, FOOD, AND HEALTH

Distance Learning Miller June 15 – August 7
This course is designed to provide an introduction to the field of Medical Anthropology in which we will examine issues related to health and illness from various perspectives outside of the Western biomedical perspective. CRN 12694

ANTH 20500 HUMAN CULTURAL DIVERSITY

Distance Learning Carillo June 15-July 10
Using concepts and models of cultural anthropology, this course will survey the principal cultural types of the world and their distribution, and will undertake a detailed analysis of society's representative of each type. CRN 12673

ANTH 23500 THE GREAT APES

Distance Learning Schulze June 15-July 10
Students will learn about the behavior and conservation of our closest relatives and how early ape studies changed our understanding of what it meant to be human. Topics include gender in science, ethics of research and cross-cultural understandings. No prerequisites. CRN 10425

ANTH 20400 INTRODUCTION TO BIOLOGICAL ANTHROPOLOGY AND HUMAN EVOLUTION

Distance Learning Aulds June 15 –August 7
This course surveys biological anthropology through a review of evolutionary theory and genetics, the fossil evidence for current theories in human evolution with insight from modern non-human primates, and the influence of environmental stressors on modern human biological variation. CRN 11346
