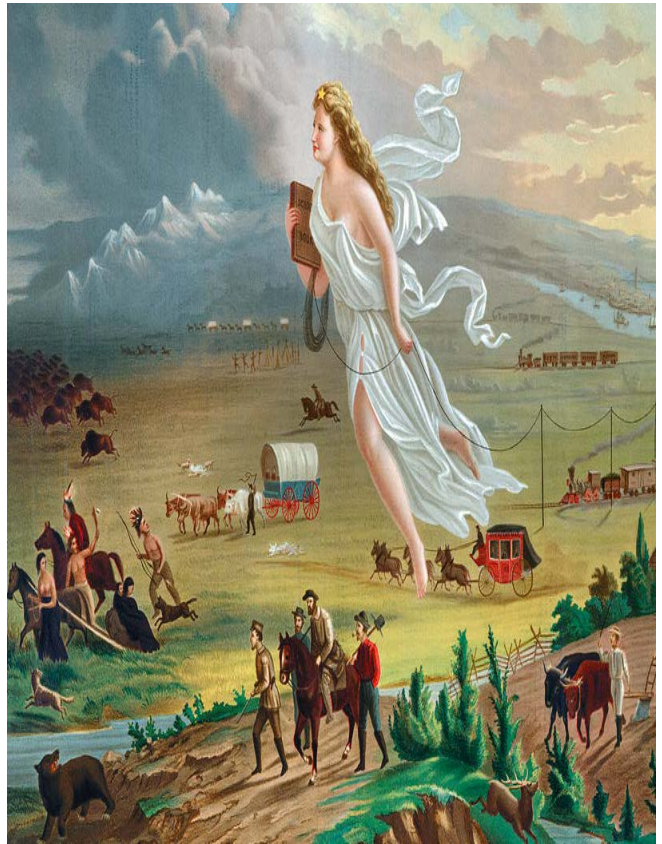


U.S. HISTORY TO 1877

HIST 151(CRN 22842 3 Credit Hours) June 14 to August 6, 2021

The story of United States History until 1877 is an exciting tale, one which this course will tell in its own unique way. Beginning with Precolonial America, students enrolled in this course will learn about the Colonial Period, the American Revolution, and early American history, which will all culminate in the Civil War and its aftermath.

Interactions between Europeans and Native Americans, the beginnings of the United States, western expansion, immigration, and the slave trade are just some of the events that will be addressed in this course. More than that, students will get a “taste” of how early Americans lived through firsthand accounts, as well as information on American culture, including music, food, and religion. We will also explore how these events are remembered, from musicals to museums, and from pop culture to popular myth.
