Kim Beck, Associate Professor, Carnegie Mellon University

Using images of architecture and landscape, Kim Beck makes drawings, prints, paintings and installations that survey peripheral and suburban spaces. Her work has been exhibited at the Walker Art Center, the Carnegie Museum of Art, Smack Mellon, Socrates Sculpture Park, Hallwalls Contemporary Art Center the Andy Warhol Museum and Mixed Greens. A recent fellow at Yaddo, she has participated in other residencies at the MacDowell Colony, the Marie Walsh Sharpe Space Program, the International Studio & Curatorial Program, Cité Internationale des Arts, Vermont Studio Center, and VCCA. She has received awards from ARS Electronica, Pollock-Krasner, Thomas J. Watson and Heinz Foundations and Printed Matter. Her recent commission for the High Line in New York will be on view through January 2012. She received her MFA from the Rhode Island School of Design and BA from Brandeis University. Beck grew up in Colorado and currently lives in Pittsburgh where she is Associate Professor at Carnegie Mellon.
