EVERYBODY by BRANDEN JACOBS-JENKINS directed by Sonita L. Surratt

Considered a contemporary masterpiece, this 2018 Pulitzer Prize finalist is a retelling of the medieval morality play *Everyman*. Branden Jacobs-Jenkins' story follows the character Everybody as they search for the meaning of life in face of Death. Each performance, a lottery will determine which actor plays Everybody offering a uniquely engaging morality tale for today.

SEPTEMBER 23 - OCTOBER 2, 2022

NORA: A DOLL'S HOUSE by STEF SMITH directed by Ann M. Shanahan

Nora hopes to be a perfect mother and wife, living in domestic bliss. However, when a secret from her past surfaces, her life begins to unravel. Set over three days in three different time periods, Nora must do what is best to protect herself and her family. Based on Henrik Ibsen's 1879 play *A Doll's House*, this modern retelling evaluates the brutality of womanhood and leaves the audience questioning how much progress we have truly made in the last century.

NOVEMBER 11 - 20, 2022

MR. BURNS: A POST ELECTRIC PLAY by ANNE WASHBURN

Written in 2012, this dark comedy explores a futuristic society shortly after a global catastrophe. A group of survivors gather for support and recount an episode of The Simpsons for entertainment. Over the threeacts and 75-year timespan of the play, the story of the episode evolves to form a myth that influences the creation of a theatre performance and other forms of entertainment in the new society. This powerful, funny play evaluates the importance of art to humanity and raises questions of how pop culture influences our day-to-day lives.
