

WGSS 282 offers an introduction to the interdisciplinary study of LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL, TRANSGENDER AND QUEER LIVES. It provides a basic grounding in theories of sexuality and LGBT histories, identities and movements in the U.S. and globally. Through course reading, film screenings, fiction, autobiographical texts and class discussion, explore the cultural and historical contexts and meanings of sexual identities and transgender identities, the formation of sexual communities, and their intersections with race, ethnicity, class, gender and nation.
