Funding

Graduate students receive funding in the form of competitive scholarships or graduate teaching assistantships that cover a tuition waiver and monthly stipend during each academic year of study. Summer funding is also available for MA/PhD students as research or teaching assistantships.

- GRE (for US citizens/permanent residents)
- TOEFL (for international applicants)
- 3 Letters of recommendation
- Personal Statement
- A language speaking sample, writing sample
