OUT WITH THE OLD





MARK SUCHMAN, PHD


Professor Suchman comes to us from Brown University, where he was a Professor of Sociology and Law. He is currently writing a book on the role of law firms in Silicon Valley, and he is midway through a multi-year project on the organizational, professional, and legal challenges surrounding new information technologies in health care. He has also written on organizational legitimacy, inter-organizational disputing practices, "internalization" of law within corporate bureaucracies, and social science approaches to

the study of contracts. Suchman has studied law and entrepreneurship in Silicon Valley, business disputing practices, and patient privacy in the American healthcare system.

His research has been supported by major grant-giving organizations, including the National Science Foundation, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, and the American Sociolegal Association, among others. His work has been featured in a number of scholarly journals, including the *Academy of Management Review*, the *Annual Review of Law and Social Science*, and *Law & Social Inquiry*. Suchman has a long history of engagement with the ABF. He completed a Doctoral Fellowship at the ABF in his early career, advised the Board of Directors Research Committee from 2013 to 2016, and has served on the External Research Review Committee (the Wheeler Committee) since 2017. Dr. Suchman is currently serving as the Executive Director of the American Bar Foundation.

Upon completion of his tenure as ABF Director, Suchman will join us on campus as a Professor of Sociology in Fall 2028.



SHIRO FURUYA

Currently a PhD candidate in Sociology at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, Shiro Furuya is affiliated in the Center for Demography and Ecology and the Center for Demography of Health and Aging. Prior to his graduate studies, he was a software developer at Fujitsu Ltd. specializing in the health care industry. His research interests include social demography, health, aging, the life course, and families around the globe. His research uncovers processes that generate inequalities. Guided by theories in the social sciences, his works revolve around addressing causal and selective processes. Empirically, most of his work draws on the counterfactual framework to disentangle causality and selection. He also integrate insights from statistical genetics

interdisciplinary synergies for social research. Furuya will serve as a Post-Doctoral Researcher at Harvard University before coming to Purdue Sociology as an Assistant Professor beginning Fall 2026.

MACKIE O'HARA-ALI, PHD

Dr. Mackie Clare O'Hara-Ali is a paleoanthropologist and dental anthropologist focused on understanding the evolution, ontogeny, and variability of primate and hominin dental enamel. She publishes and is known professionally as Dr Mackie C. O'Hara. Mackie completed her Bachelor of Arts in Anthropology at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock (2014), followed by her Master of Arts (2016) and Doctor of Philosophy (2021) in Anthropology at The Ohio State University. For her MA, she investigated seasonal perturbations that are purported to cause repetitive and cyclical enamel defects in primates from Sumatra and Borneo. The topic of her doctoral studies was understanding the relationship between enamel thickness and shape in response to



hard-object feeding in both extant primates and fossil hominins. Dr. O'Hara-Ali will join us at Purdue University in the Sociology Department, working with the Dunn Lab, as an Assistant Research Professor beginning Fall 2024.

UNIVERSITY MOVEABLE DREAM HIRE

ERIN C. DUNN, SCD, MPH

An expert epidemiologist whose research on genetics, epigenetics, childhood adversity, and baby teeth has earned her the moniker "The Science Tooth Fairy" is the most recent recruiting success in the Moveable Dream Hire program. Erin C. Dunn, ScD, MPH, will leave Harvard and the Massachusetts General Hospital to join Purdue's Department of Sociology as Professor, directing a new university-wide interdisciplinary center focused on sociogenomics. The center's goals are ambitious: to bring the genomics revolution to the social sciences and deepen the inclusion of social science research



in genetic studies. Dr. Dunn is uniquely positioned to develop the sociogenomics center. Dunn is a social and psychiatric epidemiologist with expertise in genetics and epigenetics.

Her research lab, the Dunn Lab, uses interdisciplinary approaches to better understand the social and biological factors that influence risk for depression among women, children, and adolescents. She has built national and international research collaborations that have helped to define the biological and psychosocial impact of early adversity on mental health. Dunn led several genetic association studies and gene-environment interaction studies that were the first of their kind, including publishing some of the first genome-wide association studies of depression risk in non-European ancestry populations and the first genome-wide environment interaction study of depression. Dunn is also known for her pioneering work studying children's baby teeth, using the structure of early tooth development as a novel biomarker of children's stress and adversity exposure linked to psychiatric outcomes. Dunn's research group encourages parents to donate their children's baby teeth to science to contribute to their growing data sets.

Beginning Summer 2024, the Dunn Lab will officially be at Purdue University. For more information about the Dunn Lab, visit their website!
