Co-taught by C-SPAN founder and Purdue alum, Brian Lamb, the Boilers Go to D.C. Maymester course is an immersive learning program that takes students to Washington, D.C. to study up close the historic interconnections of politics, communication, government, and news media and to learn about our nation's capital from the inside out.

About the Mentorship:

Through this Boilers Go to D.C. Maymester program students who represent a variety of majors are matched with DC alumni mentors who are seasoned professionals from a range of career fields.

Mentors share their knowledge and experience with their student mentees to help them learn about different career paths, job search strategies, and living and working in our nation's capital.

Mentorship training and discussion topics are provided for alumni mentors and students.

- Attend a 1-hour training session (virtual format)
- Meet with mentee either in person or virtually throughout the program
- Attend alumni mentor dinner and networking event

Boilers Go to D.C. Summer Scholars Internship Program

About the Course:

Undergraduate students will spend the summer in Washington, D.C., the epicenter of policy and innovation while earning academic credit with an internship in government, non-profit, or private sector. The Boilers Go to D.C. Summer Scholars Internship Program provides students with career readiness training and professional development that will help prepare them for their internships. Students will gain vital skills and hands-on experience through professional internships as well as opportunities to enhance their career readiness through alumni mentoring, networking, and meaningful reflection assignments. Students accepted into the program are required to apply for and secure an in-person summer internship that will take place in Washington, D.C.

About the Mentorship:

Through the Boilers Go to D.C. Summer Scholars Internship Program students who represent a variety of majors are matched with DC alumni mentors who are seasoned professionals from a range of career fields. Alumni mentors play a crucial role in offering insights into the job search process, reviewing resumes and cover letters, providing career guidance, and sharing their experiences and knowledge.

Mentorship training and discussion topics are provided for alumni mentors and students.

DC Alumni Mentor Commitment:

- Complete the mentorship survey and sign the Memo of Understanding and Program Guidelines
- Attend a 1-hour training session (virtual format)
- Meet with student mentee bi-weekly either in person or virtually from the first week in June through August

Once you are matched with a student, you will complete the mentor program forms and attend the mentorship training session. The number of mentor pairs will be dependent on the number of student and alumni participants.
