Freedom, Capitalism, and Institutions: Washington, D.C. Immersion” is a 3-credit economics (ECON 390) course that combines classroom learning with a Spring Break trip to Washington, D.C. Students will consider the importance of economic freedoms, such as private property and competition, for both ethical and instrumental reasons. Then they will observe the exercise of government power in the capital of one of the freest large nations in history, the United States. The field trip will include site visits, seminars with prominent economists and leaders, and seeing the federal government from the inside. The program is sponsored by the Purdue University Research Center in Economics (PURCE).
